Witold Lutoslawski: Dance Preludes

(1913 - 1994): (dedicated to the Czech Nonet)

In 1954, Lutoslawski composed *Dance Preludes* for clarinet and piano. In the following years, the composition underwent some other course. A year later, the composer scored it for clarinet and a string orchestra with percussions, piano and harp. The work was premiered at Aldenburg festival under Benjamin Britten. Last transformation of this composition took place in 1959, the impetus having been given by the Czech Nonet. The author recomposed the work again and dedicated the representative repertoire composition to this chamber ensemble. The Czech Nonet presented it many times both home and abroad and has always been a great success.

Bohuslav Martinů: NONET H 374

(1890 – 1956) (dedicated to the Czech Nonet)

A big name in Czech music, dedicated a little part of his work to the Czech Nonet. The composition came into being seven months before Martinu's death. The very composer said just before creating this piece:

"In order to get some other air in a way..., I got busy with chamber work and am writing a nonet for this superb ensemble of ours, as they have been asking for ages. Not a very practical composition (well, who plays a nonet these days, there are no more takers even for a piano quintet) but I am happy with it and hope they won't be disillusioned..."

Sergei Prokofjew: (1891 – 1953) QUINTET G-Minor op. 39 for oboe, clarinet violin, Viola und double bass (dedicated to the Czech Nonet)

In 1934, the Czech Nonet studied and premiered Prokofiev's Quintet for oboe, clarinet, violin, viola and double base. The Czech Nonet asked Prokofiev to compose a nonet for them, and the composer, being busy with other commitments; he dedicated the Quintet in G Minor to this ensemble.

Louis Spohr: Grand Nonetto op. 31 F Major

(1784 – 1859) (performed at the 1st concert in 1924)

In 1923, the Op.31 Nonet by Louis Spohr became the foundation stone of nine young musicians' repertoire who accepted the collective name the Czech Nonet.

Under this name, tying up to an artistic performance of high standard, the Czech Nonet performed for the public for the first time in history on 17 January 1924 in the Municipal House hall. Beethoven's Septuor, Op. 20, Foerster's Wood Quintet and Spohr's Nonet, Op. 31 were presented at this concert.
